In this issue we continue the publication of materials of the the annual scientific conference "Problems of methodology of modern economic science and its practical aspects in the field of competition and industrial policy", which took place on 15 March 2016. The article, which should cause an increased interest not only of the Moscow University, but also representatives of other universities, is dedicated to the methodical approach assessment to making the researcher's taring in Lomonosov State University. At the moment there is no a single decision concerning the using of ratings in the scientific and educational process, calculated on the basis of the formulas. Development proceeds by trial and error, and often negatively affects on the quality of work of university staff. At the same time, proponents of this approach appeals to the experience of foreign countries, speaking about the role of ratings in increasing the effectiveness of the universities. Identified problems can become an important contribution to the discussion of the system of ratings of scientific work at Moscow State University, draw additional attention of scientists and teachers, and possibly to initiate discussion on the pages of our journal.
